

Memorandum of Understanding for Cooperation between the Islamic Republic of Iran Broadcasting and The National Commission on Television and Radio of Republic of Armenia

The Islamic Republic of Iran Broadcasting and The National Commission on Television and Radio of Republic of Armenia hereinafter referred to as the contracting parties, in order to develop and strengthen friendly relations between the two countries and in the direction of expanding broadcasting cooperations between the two organizations, signed the following memorandum of understanding. The two parties are required to fulfill the norms of this memorandum to the extend that it doesn't contradict the internal legislation of the two parties.

Article 1

The two parties can cooperate in the area of news and undertake to exchange news packages in various political, economic, cultural, scientific, sporting and youth fields free of charge.

Article 2

The two parties will cooperate with each other's news or production delegations and provide them with necessary facilities as far as they can . The party which sends them should bear transportation and accommodation costs.



Article 3

The two parties can exchange radio and television programmes including documentary, feature films, series, animations and musics free of charge. Obviously, the receiving party has no right to grant the programmes to a third party without the sending party's consent.

Article 4

The two parties can undertake to produce joint programmes.

Terms and conditions of each joint project should be determined in a separate agreement.

Article 5

The two parties can purchase from and sell to each other various radio and television programmes including documentary, animations, feature films and TV series. The relevant costs should be calculated and finalized in separate agreements.

Article 6

Depending on each other's needs, the two parties will run short term courses in various fields and exchange researches carried out in the media areas. The cost of running the courses should be determined in mutual agreements.



Article 7

The two parties can cooperate in technical areas. These areas include training, exchanging technical experiences and selling equipments. The cost of each single case should be determined in a separate agreement.

Article 8

The two parties can undertake to invite each other to the festivals and exhibitions which will be held in their countries.

The participating party should bear the costs of participating in these events.

Article 10

Regarding other mutually interested matters, the two parties' experts will discuss the matters.

Article 11

The two parties will consult with each other to unify their positions in the regional and international broadcasting unions and protect their common interests.



Article 12

This memorandum of understanding will be valid for three years from the date of its final signature and could be extended by a mutual written agreement for another three years.

This MOU is signed in English languages on February 19, 2014, in Tehran.
